"I came back to Christian Recovery Centers for the second time as a resident in 2022. This time I knew I had to stay working for the Lord. The first time I left the program early - I had let other people affect my recovery.

I graduated in April of 2022, and I had already been working with the landscaping team leading up to my graduation for several weeks. I worked under the superintendent for a few months, and in the Summer of 2022, Christian Recovery Centers Landscaping contracted with Barefoot

Resort & Golf to handle the general landscaping work around all four of their golf courses.

I was given a team of three individuals combined of residents participating in the Workforce Redevelopment Program, as well as program graduates like me.

Most of my days working at Barefoot consist of general maintenance, sod installation, tree trimming, and mulching- Hard work that I genuinely enjoyed. Each day I approached work as it says in Colossians 3:23 - "Whatever you do, work at it with all your heart, as working for the Lord, not for human masters."

In March of 2023, a course supervisor offered me a full-time position on their team. At the time, I had no personal means of transportation - so I told him I couldn't immediately accept the job. A friend and former employee of Christian Recovery Centers quickly made it possible for me to purchase a vehicle from him near the end of May 2023, allowing me to formally accept the position at Barefoot.

When you're willing to work hard for the Lord and are patient for things to happen on His time, He will bless you beyond your imagination.

My goals for the future are to be able to move into my own house or apartment and continue to work the steps for my recovery. The Phase 4 program at Christian Recovery Centers is helping to make this transition possible, as I'm able to continue to stay on campus while working at my new job and toward my future goals."

We have raised over \$2.6 million toward this expansion through various grants and generous donations from supporters like you.

It is going to take a total of \$3.6 million to complete this expansion.

The You Can Project officially launched in May of 2023, with the goal of raising \$1 Million towards the expansion of our new facilities in Shallotte at 520 Mulberry St. as well as funding for additional repurposing of facilities to be used for Phase 4 Residents.

Since June 2023, we have raised over \$22,000 toward this goal thanks to our generous donors and outreach efforts from our team.

Our video production for the project has been viewed over 4000 times and shared more than 100 times.

We are so grateful for the support of our staff and community members for getting this message out and supporting Christian Recovery Centers in our mission to be able to directly influence long-term recovery.

Prior to 2023, one of Christian Recovery Center's main deficiencies was the ability to provide care past the initial program of approximately 6 months. It became our ambition to focus our efforts in developing a program to extend our overall length of care by 18 months. Through prayer, dedication, and joint efforts by our staff, donors and volunteers, we were able to officially launch the Phase 4 Program in 2023.

Recently William "Bo" Grasty went above and beyond for a resident. Once arriving at a local dental office to take a resident to have corrective oral surgery, he soon found out that they could not take him in. After leaving, Bo knew that the resident needed this taken care of before the Fundraiser trip coming up the following week. Bo and the resident walked into Aspen Dental and began to pray. Soon one of the ladies that worked there found out that the men were from Christian Recovery Centers and got him a same day appointment.

"It was incredible. Turns out some of the staff had family who had gone through the program at CRCI. They prayed with us and helped our brother. It was a day I won't soon forget." said Bo.

The result was amazing. Bo got the resident the appointment, left and worked at the Chamber of Commerce, and came back to bring all residents home for the day, a clear depiction of his never give up attitude, love for a brother, and perseverance.

Bo has been a major component in this program after becoming an LDI upon his graduation working with the admissions team, program operations, with future opportunities in Development. He has made a major impact on others here already.

Before CRCI, "Brunswick Christian Recovery Center" was what we called home. Over the years, various supporters have allowed us to participate in fundraising trips which help pave the way for current, and future residents. "These trips have played a huge part in our growth", said Josh Torbich, CEO. "I remember many trips that I personally went on, and I'm so

Tyler Smith, COO, said "These trips enable the residents to invest in their own recovery process and directly contribute to the overall goal of social redevelopment. They allow us the opportunity to bring residents into environments where they will be able to practice confronting elements of daily living that may have influenced their addictive behaviors in the past. It is an important part of our recovery philosophy that we prepare residents in every way possible to face their addiction in real life. Social development, confidence, work ethic, and an understanding of the reality of community re-entry is exactly what we strive to attain with these trips and our Phase 4 re-entry program, which provides an additional 18 months of transitional care."

While some residents may choose to break the rules while on these trips (smoking, cell phone use, etc.) CRCI reports that these trips play a monumental role in the recovery process that cannot be experienced in a classroom. Smith said, "Even when residents break the rules, many come to realize that they have identified a critical piece of themselves that they must come to terms with. It's realizing these decisions carry weight, and when you're in

recovery, every decision matters. CRCI is providing the environment, support, and protection of their overall well-being to guide residents through this very moment.

We want residents to be successful in long-term recovery. That's the goal here at CRCI."

Ryan Hartman (left), current resident 4 months into the recovery program at CRCI said - "It gave me more ambition. I have been here longer than most of the guys, so it put me in leader mode. Straying away from temptation is a major part of recovery and I was put right in front of alcohol and was able to stay away from it."

"The definition of insanity is doing the same thing over and over and expecting different results. In my life this looked like a vicious cycle of lying, stealing, manipulation, pride, guilt, and shame leaving me desperately grasping for anything to fill the black hole of a void in the deepest part of my heart and soul ultimately weaving drugs and alcohol into that vicious cycle. After multiple charges, strain on my marriage and family and numerous failed attempts at Godless recovery,

I found myself at my rock bottom with nowhere else to go. In October of 2022 I signed myself into detox where I chose to make the commitment to a long-term facility. On January 16, 2023, I walked through the doors of the Rose House scared, confused, and unsure of who I was. I came in looking for sobriety and what I found was who I am in Christ and recovery not only from my addiction but recovery from low self-worth, mental health, and total family restoration. After 25 years of addiction, God has redirected my life and provided me with the ability to help others proving that He doesn't call the equipped, but he equips the call. I am forever grateful for the staff and residents of CRCI for leading me to God and giving me my life back."







JON HOWARD Graduate 11.14.2022

"I remember walking around outside aimlessly in circles while staring at the clear skies above, and screaming, "When will YOU ever be enough for me"? I was lost in a deep dark bondage, enslaved to alcohol and opiates. After 40 years of addiction my life had become unmanageable, my belief system dysfunctional, my thoughts suicidal and living as a recluse alienated from society. I was full of shame, guilt, bitterness, resentments, remorse, regrets and insecurities. After the death of my dear Mother, my greatest fear became reality, I was all alone...or so I thought.

God used that event as the catalyst for searching and finding CRCI. While attending the program, God allowed everything to be stripped away from me, giving me the free choice to either deny Him or place him in His rightful place above all my wants and desires for my life. During this intense process of submission, surrender and trusting, CRCI provided me with a brotherhood, staff, pastors, behavior therapist and a 12-Step sponsor that supported, encouraged, loved and ministered to my mind, body and spirit.

Jesus is the Lord of my life, and he resides above all things in my life. I am believing and have faith that God is restoring all I lost in my addiction. He has shown me that His purpose for my life is my passion, and my passion is recovery. I now get to serve CRCI in a financial role as a staff member and give back what was freely given to me. Addiction robbed me of 40 years of my life, but I've never been more excited to live and soon be picking up my 1-year chip symbolizing freedom from all mind-altering substances including a 2 pack per day nicotine addiction."

Larry comes to Christian Recovery Center's Landscaping Team from Rutherfordton, NC, stepping into the Superintendent position in April, 2023.

We are so thankful to have Larry's experience and leadership on our Enterprise Team, and look forward to what he and our Landscaping crews are able to accomplish!

"What is the Workforce Redevelopment Program?"

It is the goal of Christian Recovery Centers to produce opportunities in the residential recovery setting that will translate into lived experience, training hours and resume items for future employment.

Our Landscaping and Cleaning Services, along with administrative roles provide experience and opportunity for learning how to productively handle the responsibilities of employment coupled with a sober life. Residents participate in the WRP starting with just 16 hours/week for the first 4-6 weeks in their recovery program to slowly acclimate this balance of introducing work into sobriety. From there, every 4-6 weeks adds an additional 8 hours/week so that upon graduation residents are acclimated to a 32-hour work week. As residents transition into the Phase 4 program, a traditional 40-hour work week can be introduced, or they may decide to return to the workforce on their own. The WRP is positioned to provide invaluable experience for future employment through serving as a benchmark for a new trade or career path.
