

MESSAGE FROM CRCI'S CEO

All across America today, in a larger portion than ever before, people are waking up in the trenches of addiction wishing they could find recovery. Many will reach many more low points in their journey before they actually become committed to a new process and a new way of living. This September I'll be celebrating 10 years of sobriety and 10 years with Christion Recovery Centers. In all of my time here I've never seen someone seeking admission to one of our recovery programs on the back end of a major winning streak. Some have resources that haven't yet been depleted and some have nothing left, but one thing they all have in common is that they are at a major low point in life and seeking recovery.

I often think about one of the most influential items that helped me early on in my process of recovery when I arrived at CRCI horribly addicted to heroin: "community and fellowship." My past behaviors and degenerated way of living turned me into someone comfortable with hiding away from society. I thought to myself "only if I could avoid running into anyone who ever saw me in the grips of my addiction then I would feel safe and protected." I had no idea that there was this whole other world out there that would allow me to build a recovered life by simply embracing my past. We find evidence of this in the Big Book of AA when the 9th step promises reads: "We will not regret the past nor wish to shut the door on it. We will comprehend the word Serenity and

we will know peace. No matter how far down the scale we have gone, we will see how our experience can benefit others. That feeling of uselessness and self-pity will disappear."

CRCI taught me that you can never fully recover, separated from society or hiding from past failures and tragedies. We are still teaching this concept to everyone who walks through the doors today. Thank God He takes us from *Recovery to Recovered*.

The definition of insanity is doing the same thing over and over and expecting different results. In my life this looked like a vicious cycle of lying, stealing, manipulation, pride, guilt, and shame leaving me desperately grasping for anything to fill the black hole of a void in the deepest part of my heart and soul ultimately weaving drugs and alcohol into that vicious cycle. After multiple charges, strain on my marriage and family and numerous failed attempts at Godless recovery, I found myself at my rock bottom with nowhere else to go. In October of 2022 I signed myself into detox where I chose to make the commitment to a long-term facility. On January 16, 2023, I walked through the doors of the Rose House scared, confused, and unsure of who I was. I came in looking for sobriety and what I found was who I am in Christ and recovery not only from my addiction but recovery from low self-worth, mental health, and total family restoration. After 25 years of addiction, God has redirected my life and provided me with the ability to help others proving that He doesn't call the equipped, but he equips the call. I am forever grateful for the staff and residents of CRCI for leading me to God and giving me my life

I remember walking around outside aimlessly in circles while staring at the clear skies above, and screaming, "When will YOU ever be enough for me"? I was lost in a deep dark bondage, enslaved to alcohol and opiates. After 40 years of addiction my life had become unmanageable, my belief system dysfunctional, my thoughts suicidal and living as a recluse alienated from society. I was full of shame, guilt, bitterness, resentments, remorse, regrets and insecurities. After the death of my dear Mother, my greatest fear became reality, I was all alone...or so I thought.

God used that event as the catalyst for searching and finding CRCI. While attending the program, God allowed everything to be stripped away from me, giving me the free choice to either deny Him or place him in His rightful place above all my wants and desires for my life. During this intense process of submission, surrender and trusting, CRCI provided me with a Brotherhood, Staff, Pastors, Behavior Therapist and a 12 Step Sponsor that supported, encouraged, loved and ministered to my mind, body and spirit.

Jesus is the Lord of my life and he resides above all things in my life. I am believing and have faith that God is restoring all I lost in my addiction. He has shown me that His purpose for my life is my passion and my passion is recovery. I now get to serve CRCI in a financial role as a staff member and give back what was freely given to me. Addiction robbed me of 40 years of my life but I've never been more excited to live and soon be picking up my 1 year chip symbolizing freedom from all mind altering substances including a 2 pack day nicotine addiction.

We have raised over \$2.6 million toward this expansion through various grants and generous donations from supporters like you.

CRCI increasing care from 6 months to 24 months!

Since 2010, Christian Recovery Centers, Inc has focused on providing the spiritual and educational tools necessary for a long-term recovery from the illness of addiction and the beginning of a successful life.

In 2010, we could house and serve 12 men on our pursuit of providing healing and restoration to our residents suffering from addiction.

Today, CRCI provides 74 residential beds for men and women in need of substance use disorder treatment.

But wait- there's more!

In November of 2022, CRCI went under contract on a 5.5 acre campus located at 520 Mulberry St. Shallotte, NC. This new campus came with a 23,000 sq ft facility that would give CRCI the ability to offer 110 additional residential treatment beds for our men's program.

We Can reach the next generation.

Since 2019 Christian Recovery Centers has been blessed to have the opportunity to support our local school system by teaching and speaking on the horrors of addiction to the students. This past semester was one of the most impactful sessions that we've had the opportunity to host. Most of the people that we see in our recovery programs will tell you that they began experimenting in their middle and high school years. It is with this in mind that CRCI sees a great opportunity ahead of the curve with a preventative style method. These sessions with the students have many items that cover some of the most dangerous segments about substance abuse but one of the more impactful items always proves to be the personal testimonies.

Every semester young people from inside our recovery programs volunteer to come to the schools to share their testimonies and real life experiences. Most of the individuals sharing their story have only been sober 1-2 months and are still very much in the midst of a major life cleanup. It's amazing to see the students engaged in active listening when they see someone who looks, talks, and acts like them but is currently in a residential recovery program sharing their real life experience in addiction. For many students these conversations have only been hypothetical and presented in a classroom setting with no real context.

It is our hope that with these efforts CRCI can reach students who are at the point of decision. One of the topics that is always framed up by CRCI staff is the concept of the Wolf in Sheep's clothing, understanding that the consequences of substance use don't come immediately. We paint the picture that most people's first experience with drugs or alcohol is quite euphoric and engaging and fixes the way they feel in the moment but the consequences will show up in the years to come.
