## CEO LETTER

It's hard to believe the trajectory Christian Recovery Centers, Inc. (CRCI) has been on for the past six or seven years. When I think back to 2019 and remember the 14 residential beds nestled within the fields of our beautiful and timely Ash campus, I find great joy. Today, knowing that we are able to serve over 217 individuals right here in Brunswick County often makes me stop what I'm doing and thank God for His goodness and mercy. He helped our little nonprofit grow into something that could reach and impact more individuals plagued with the illness of addiction, for the sake of seeing these individuals' lives restored. Our most recent addition of Bryant's Orchard is a story of that same sentiment. God has allowed us to step into yet another dose of His favor in a way that can help expand what He has planned for the ministry.





I was recently sent a photo from one of our graduates who was spending time with his son for the first time since he had gotten sober. It made me feel so happy when I saw the fruits of his labor were allowing him to nestle back into the family that he thought he had lost for good. They had spent the weekend together and shared many moments and conversations about what the past two years had held while he had been going through the recovery programs. While it seemed like an insignificant moment if you were looking from the outside in, knowing what I know, I saw it as a mountain that was moved. I know that there's still a lot more work left to do for this young man who is well on his way to restoring the relationship with his son and ultimately his family, but this moment called for a great sense of celebration. It was almost like God was sending something in the form of encouragement to remind this program graduate to keep moving forward on the same path that he had been committed to.

I know what it's like to go through a dry season where it's difficult to find meaningful moments. I especially know how frustrating it is after you feel like you've worked really hard and things just aren't working for you in a way that you thought they would. On that same note, I also understand how impactful it is when God gives you the Almighty wink with something wonderfully unexpected coming to encourage you. The reminder that I sent to him was subtle but simple. I said, "Let today be a day that encourages you, but doesn't even come close to satisfying you." I've come to learn really quickly that oftentimes God sends me things in my life that are simply fulfilled promises brought on by my direct attention to discovering and discarding the things that were previously blocking me off from Him. Our job as people in recovery is to make sure that those things that God has sent to encourage us do not allow us to become complacently satisfied with where He has brought us. The best is yet to come. **Thank you, Lord.**
