Sometimes the struggles we face begin long before we fully understand them. At the age of 11, I was introduced to pornography, and it became readily available to me. When I married Sarah in 1995, I thought that the porn would go away but it didn't. I used it as a coping mechanism for life's difficulties and as a way to "get back" when I felt hurt. It was a very selfish thing to do and severely damaged my wife and marriage. But God was in pursuit of me! In October of 1997 at a Promise Keepers event in Washington DC, Jesus met me while praying in a group of men that I did not know- and still don't. God marked me but I didn't surrender and make Him Lord. By 2006 my selfishness and addiction to pornography led to depression, suicidal thoughts, and I was an angry husband and father. I had relapsed hundreds of times and was SO TIRED OF FAILING my God, my wife, and myself that suicide seemed the only permanent solution. But God wasn't done with me! That year the Holy Spirit was working on my heart. He showed me the pain that I'd caused Sarah and He used my circumstances to bring me to full submission. God was made King in my life for the first time and for the first time I had victory over addiction. He created within me a new heart and a steadfast spirit within me.



I first connected with CRCI through Josh Torbich, whom I met at the Bridge to 100 Conference in 2023, thanks to a mutual friend, Lew Davis. Josh later invited Sarah and me to the Gala that same year, and my involvement with CRCI has been deeply meaningful ever since. Every day, I am honored to walk alongside individuals whom society may have given up on. Seeing Jesus transform their identity and give them hope and purpose is what makes this work so rewarding.

A fun fact about me: I once broke both of my wrists falling from a horse while riding bareback, spending three months in casts! Life has taught me to persevere, to laugh, and to trust in God's plan. Through every trial, I am grateful for the journey, for redemption, and for the opportunity to give back with faith, dedication, and a heart full of gratitude.
