### A MESSAGE FROM OUR CEO

Christmas has always been a big deal in my family—since before I can remember. My mom has a special gift for building anticipation for the season. It was almost like the starting gun at the beginning of a race: the day after Thanksgiving, all our focus shifted to Christmas.

One of the most memorable phrases we'd hear throughout the season was, "Isn't it so cool that it's Jesus' birthday, but He decided to let us have the presents?" I love that comment so much that I carry it with me today, sharing it with my own children as we approach what can often feel like the most materialistic time of year.

I understand that this may not be the exact season Jesus was born, but I find it to be the perfect reminder to slow down and refocus my sights on the greatest gift ever given to humanity—our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. Being evangelical at heart, I have a special interest in using this season to segue many conversations into that wonderful gift given over 2,000 years ago when God sent His Son.

With the work I'm part of today, I carry an underlying hope that everyone who steps foot into CRCI will come to recognize that gift—no matter what time of year they walk through our doors.

I'm sure many of you have heard the phrase, "Jesus is the answer." I recently found myself saying this to someone after hearing a brief summary of the wreckage from his past. This person had tried recovery many times, facing heartache and discouragement along the way. As he explained the multiple current dilemmas he was facing, I touched his shoulder and said, "Jesus is the answer."

The next question he asked was the one I had hoped for: "How so?"

If you study the life of Christ, you'll see He was on a special mission that constantly brought Him into interactions with people who were in tight spots—whether it was a man lying by the pool of Bethesda hoping for healing, or a man considered insane due to countless demonic possessions. Christ was always engaging with people in some form of wreckage.

As He approached these situations, the greatest gift He carried was freedom. His entire ministry on earth was about creating freedom for people enslaved by their current affliction. Some were born into it; for others, it was the result of choices they had made. Regardless, Christ brought freedom.

Jesus explains this Himself in John 10:10: "The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy; I have come that they may have life, and have it more abundantly."

After sharing this with my troubled friend, a hymn came to mind. I'm not much of a singer, but in that moment, I felt it was appropriate to make him suffer through me carrying the tune of the chorus: "Because He lives, I can face tomorrow. Because He lives, all fear is gone. Because I know He holds the future, And life is worth the living just because He lives."

Such great hope is found in that song—and it all became a promise fulfilled in the season we celebrate the greatest gift: Jesus.

Even with our first group of residents getting settled into Bryant's Orchard, the overall excitement remains in the air. When we consider the total impact of this campus, we gain a deeper appreciation for both its current and potential effects on the individuals we serve.

Since opening the new 50-bed residential motivational track site serving our Brunswick County operation for males, we've continued to implement complementary project elements that enhance CRCl's overall impact, including **expanding our female occupancy by 30%.** With generous support this past year from Sacred Heart Church, Landfall Foundation, Knights of Columbus, and many private donors, our oldest campus in Ash received a much-needed facelift in the bathroom facilities to accommodate motivational track services exclusively for females. After navigating permitting hurdles, we're finally preparing to make this space available to women in need in the months ahead.

Another exciting development is CRCI's horticulture program, now partnering with Brunswick Community College to launch acres of homegrown fruit and vegetable farming. Coupled with a core curriculum, this new element of our Workforce Redevelopment Program will not only provide education for our residents but also help sustain CRCI's ability to serve over 1,000 meals a day.

As we approach the final months of Bryant's Orchard capital campaign, we are actively seeking meaningful donors like you to help us create much-needed resources for those in long-term recovery.


