TESTIMONY - ROSE HOUSE - DEONNA SMITH

I have been fighting with the devil my entire life—from childhood into adulthood. Looking back, I can see how early the battle began. As the oldest child, I often felt unloved, overlooked, and treated as the black sheep. I believed my mother loved my siblings more than me, and that belief planted seeds of hurt, rejection, and rebellion that followed me for years.

I was raised in the church and knew who God was, but I didn't understand His love for me. Instead, I learned to numb my pain. My first drink came from my father when I was still a child. Not long after, I took brandy from my mother's house to school. My teacher thought I was pregnant. I stopped drinking for a while, but the damage had already begun.

As I got older, the drinking returned at family parties, then clubs and bars. I started smoking weed and eventually selling it. I was good at it—too good. Even during a drought, I always had supply and made money. I dated a Jamaican man for twelve years, and smoking became a lifestyle. When weed made my mind race, I quit—but replaced it with cigarettes. Then the devil offered something stronger. I stopped selling weed and started selling crack, then cocaine powder. With every step, I sank deeper and further from God.

I dated a man whose voice alone warned me he was trouble. My life spiraled. I put cocaine in my cigarettes and drank heavily. When my mother passed away, I buried my grief in drugs and alcohol. Another relationship followed, and even then, the devil kept working. A cigarette laced with crack opened the door again. But God never stopped chasing me.

A rose with thorns, but God still picked me.

Today, I stand knowing I am God's child, redeemed through Christ. I'm learning to let Him lead. My goal is to stay sober, grow closer to God, and walk in His will. The devil tried to destroy me, but God saved me. And this time, I'm choosing Him.



TESTIMONY- CRCI-WEST - TIMOTHY A. LONG

First and foremost, I give all glory to God. If it were not for His love, grace, and mercy, I would not be standing here today. Before I came to CRCI, I had already achieved eight months of sobriety. On the outside, it looked like I was doing well but, on the inside, I was broken. I was battling deep depression, intense anxiety, and overwhelming fear.

I had completed multiple programs and learned a lot about recovery, yet something was still missing. The truth is, I was sober, but I was spiritually empty. When I walked through the doors of CRCI, I knew immediately this place was different. I told myself; this is where I will find myself, because God is here. That's when my true recovery began.

At CRCI, I focused on repairing my relationship with God and healing my spirit. For the first time, I was surrounded by people who were healing just like I was. I no longer felt alone or misunderstood, we became a family, healing together. It was here that I opened the Bible for the first time, and that is where my life truly changed. God's Word spoke to me in a way nothing ever had before. I found forgiveness, grace, and learned how to love again. No matter what I was struggling with, the Bible always gave me an answer. When I was lost, I found God's love and in finding Him, He restored me. God took someone who was hopeless and unwilling and transformed me into a willing vessel ready to spread hope, love, and compassion to others.

The saying "hurt people hurt people" is true, but **at CRCI, healing people help heal people.** Every resident and every staff member played a role in my healing journey, and for that, I am truly grateful. Most of all, I thank God for saving me, restoring me, and giving me a new life.

CURRENT GIFTS
